Creates art work that depicts objects and events and/or expresses feelings, thoughts, and ideas through a variety of two-dimensional and threedimensional processes and share about them.


Uses perceptual information to guide motions and interactions with objects and other people.

CLASSROOM NEWS

MONDAY: The boys and girls created "Shape Caterpillars" by arranging their shapes on a strip of paper to create a pattern. We will be sharing these observations with you at Parent/Teacher Conferences in November. The children were introduced to the song, "Marching Ants" on the Smart Board. This song has now been added to our classroom songbook.

TUESDAY: For Small Group Time, the boys and girls were given a basket of counting bears in three different colors and three different sizes. They were asked to sort their bears into the three circles on the sorting mat and explain how they sorted them. We will also be sharing this observation with you at conferences. The children enjoyed moving their bodies to the Listen and Move song. This song was added to the classroom songbook.

WEDNESDAY: The boys and girls were introduced to their journals during small group time. Each journal contains their name tag as well as an alphabet chart for helping the children practice writing letters, their names, other names, and words. Today the boys and girls drew a self portrait in their journal. We will share your child's journal with you at conferences. Two children chose songs for everyone to sing and move their bodies for Large Group Time.
